


1973:

- 72% of the workforce had only a high school education
- · High school diploma: Gateway to American Dream
- "Middle-Class life": Achievable without college degree



2018:






2/3 of jobs will require some post-secondary education

 Just 36% of job openings will require only a High School Diploma (half of what it was in 1973)



Student Demographics by Ethnicity for 2012-13




Breaking myth that community college grads earn less: A.A./A.S. vs B.S./B.A.

- 27% of license or certificate holders earn more than an average bachelor's degree
- Lifetime gap between those with HS diploma and B.A. is nearly \$1,000,000
- Those with B.A. earn 65% more annually than those with only a HS Diploma
- Those with an A.A./A.S. earn 73% more than those with no HS Diploma










Degree Breakdown

College for All does not mean everyone needs a B.A. Even in this decade, most jobs do not require a B.A.



Not a "one size fits all" model

Pathway to four-year universities



- 60% of CSU graduates transferred from CCC
- 30% of UC system graduates transferred from CCC
- 2/3 of California's first-time higher education students begin academics at Community College
- Earn GPA equal or better than freshman who start at 4year institutions

Not a "one size fits all" model

Stunning numbers from the CCC system

- 100,000 degrees and certificates annually
- 175 workforce fields annually
- Over 3/4 of firefighters, law enforcement officers, EMT, and Nurses receive education at Community Colleges



California Community Colleges

The largest system of higher education in the country



- Highest rate of attendance in nation
- 1/4 nationwide in California Community Colleges
- 3/10 Californians age 18-24

The Primary gateway to higher education, serving all Californians

- 70% of students are of minority backgrounds
- Enroll the state's lowest-income students. Full-time students have annual median income of \$16,223. 1/4 have incomes of less than \$5,544 per year
- Veterans receiving GI Bill educational benefits attend a Community College
- Over half of Community College students are age 25 or older and are working adults
